Course Description

This course emphasizes the development of basic painting techniques and skills using acrylic paint, other paint media, stretched canvas, and other varied supports. Course work is based on working from observation and resource materials through basic color theory, as related to plasticity of form and space. Students explore a variety of painting techniques and concepts to build a foundation for developing expressive and representation skills in painting.

Student Learning Outcomes

After completion of the course students will be able to:

- 1. Manifest ideas, theory and practice of painting and related media in material form.
- 2. Synthesize personal artistic expression of painting and related media design, style and vision into indigenous, Native, and Himdag ideas and artifacts.
- 3. Intentionally manipulate painting and related media, elements and principles to specific outcomes

Course Structure

This course is designed as an online studio art course. The course structure will be based off a series of modules. Each module will contain study assignments and a painting assignment. Consider "study assignments" to be the practice and introduction of a painting technique or painting approach. Consider "painting assignments" to be the final of a module that is focused on the taught painting technique or painting approach.

Himdag Cultural Component

Painting I, ART 205 will focus to imbed Tohono O'odham Himdag in projects that manifest ideas, theory and practice of visual, painted and related media in material form and to intentionally manipulate, through a series of painting and related media methods to specific outcomes. Students will work to create fresh approaches to representation of traditional cultural artifacts, modes of production, symbolic representation and iconography.

Tohono O'odham traditions and cultural beliefs will be discussed as relevant to course topics, and only as appropriate to the Tohono O'odham Nation's traditional standards for sharing information.

The predominant pedagogical practice in this course is that of group demonstration and other forms of demonstrative non-verbal communication.

Policies and Expectations

Attendance Policy

You are expected to arrive to class on time and be prepared to participate in each class period. Four unexcused absences may result in withdrawal and a "W" or "Y" will be recorded. You may request to be excused from class for religious observances and practices, for illness, for school or work-related travel or for personal or family emergency. If you will be absent, please notify the instructor as soon as possible (approved by Faculty Senate April 2014).

Incomplete Policy

Incomplete (I) grades are not awarded automatically. The student must request an "I" from the instructor who can choose to award an Incomplete only if all three of the following conditions are met:

- 2. The student must have unavoidable circumstance that would prohibit the student from completing the course.
- 3. The student must have completed over 75% of the course requirements with at least a "C" grade.
