Course Description:

Introduction to conversational Tohono O'odham. Development of communication skills to achieve basic proficiency in the language. Includes greetings, interpersonal transactions, proper pronunciation of the O'odham sound system and an emphasis on cultural perspectives

- Learn common O'odham words and phrases.
- Understand the communication transactions of traditional O'odham.
- Explore O'odham dialect differences and how they are evolving.
- Students will gain confidence in speaking the O'odham language.

- Transcribe recorded conversations. Different dialects added
- ZOOM Group discussions will aid student's inquiries.
- Tests will be given from time to time to gauge comprehension of class subjects.
- FINAL PRESENTATION; Make a 4 minute presentation/demonstration using O'odham dialogue

Texts and Materials:
