. Pre-College/GED is a year-round program that is only closed on rec-ognized federal and TOCC employee holidays. Four options are available for students interested in earning high school equivalency.

Another choice is independent study, which gives students the flexibility of working at their own pace. The GED program provides school supplies to get a student started.
