**AIMS Key Indicator System 2022 (AKIS 2022)**

The AIHEC American Indian Measures for Success (AIHEC-AIMS) project has two goals: 1) to define relevant quantitative and qualitative indicator data of American Indian student success, as determined by the tribal colleges, and 2) to develop and implement a strategy for collecting, analyzing, and presenting annually the success indicator data using electronic information management tools. Through data collection and analysis, this project provides the foundation for systemic reform that significantly increases - and for the first time, accurately measures - American Indian success in higher education.

At the spring 2004 meeting, the AIHEC Board of Directors passed the following resolution in support of the AIHEC-AIMS project:

“The AIHEC Board of Directors should take an active role in the development of a definition of Tribal College and University student success and should support the AIHEC-Lumina initiative. Further, each Tribal College should participate, to the maximum extent possible, in all activities associated with the initiative.”

The AIMS Key Indicator System (AKIS) was developed under the guidance of the AIMS Advisory Panel and Tribal College and University presidents and registrars. AIHEC would like to express its appreciation for the time and effort given during the development of the instruments.

<p>Tohono O'odham Community College was chartered by the Tohono O'odham Nation (Nation) in 1998, operated under the auspices of Pima Community College until 2005, and became fully accredited by the Higher Learning Commission in 2005. The College's main campus, S-cuk Du'ag (Black Mountain) is located 12 miles east of Sells, the seat of government and the largest settlement on the Nation. TOCC maintains a site 2.5 miles west of Sells, a site in Phoenix, and a site at San Carlos Apache. The latter, while a site of TOCC, is an unaccredited college: San Carlos Apache College. SCAC is working to become an independent college in its own right and that process should be complete by 2025-2026. TOCC is one of 35 tribal colleges and universities and is currently serving over 900 students (fall semester 2022), 95% of whom are Native American. Enrollment is up from 480 students, where it was before the COVID-19 pandemic and that situation has persisted, a counter trend to what many community colleges experienced during years 1 and 2 of the pandemic. TOCC's dual mission includes strengthening the O'odham Himdag (language, culture, and lifeways) through provision of quality education. TOCC currently provides 14 Associate degrees including in Tohono O'odham Studies. In addition to its course delivery, the TOCC provides community service. The major current initiative is the hosting of the "O'odham Language Center" which has as its charge the reclamation of O'odham language, which is listed as endangered by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). That project links the College with the Nation's Head Start programs in support of O'odham language immersion programs. While the primary constituents of the TOCC are the Tohono O'odham and other O'odham, the College is an open-enrollment public institution and serves Native and non-Native students. The College currently serves nearly 70 tribal nations in the US and Canada.</p>	
Please share the top two successes of your institution for Academic Year 2021-22.	
<p>Success number one: Wellness Initiative</p> <p>Tohono O'odham Community College has completed construction and opening of the Apedag Ki: (Wellness Center) at its main campus at S-cuk Du'ag (Black Mountain outside of Sells). The center opened in November 2022 and provides a space for students, staff, and faculty to workout. Plans include development of group education classes, workshops on healthy eating, and development of fitness clubs all aimed at increasing wellness and thereby enhancing the educational experience. In addition to the Apedag Ki:, TOCC is now providing healthy food through its kitchen at the main campus. Meals are provided free of charge for students and employees as well as for community members who stop by and can show they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.</p> <p>Success number two: Back to Campus</p> <p>Tohono O'odham Community College is working to bring a face-to-face community back to the main campus at S-cuk Du'ag (Black Mountain). The COVID-19 pandemic was met by moving 100% online and as the opportunity for bringing back a vibrant life with face-to-face interactions TOCC has seized on it and worked to make more classes available through hybrid modalities and to provide activities that could encourage students to return in person. There has been limited success to date and numbers of students opting to be on campus in person have not returned to anywhere near the pre-pandemic levels. Dorms have been opened and 20 students are in the dorms as of fall semester 2022, though there are spaces for up to 36 students. TOCC will continue to work on this important aspect of its student experience.</p>	

**Please share one or two significant challenges faced by your institution in AY 2021-22 (e.g., faculty changes, natural disaster, funding cuts, etc.).**

1. Tohono O'odham Community College is facing substantial difficulty in maintaining its fiscal operation. Maintaining trained and sufficient staff for payroll, accounts payable, and grants management has proven difficult. Job descriptions have been rewritten in some cases, salaries have been adjusted in others, and third-party resources (example: Your Part Time Controller) have been brought in to assist. In addition to the challenge of maintaining a workforce, the workload has increased. While the advent of additional funding made possible through federal government grants is welcome, the workload, including for administration and grant reporting, is challenging indeed.

2. The advent of the pandemic in spring 2020 marked the transition of Tohono O'odham Community College's course delivery from nearly 100% face-to-face to nearly 100% online. The change meant that services that had been provided face-to-face needed to be provided remotely. Those services ran the gamut. One very basic element the College needed, but lacked, was an electronic application that worked smoothly, gathered all the needed information from prospective students, and that could turn around upon receipt of an application and automatically provide a student ID, password, and email address. That, and a number of other elements involved in the process, all needed to be automated. Even with the assistance of a third-party, the work took many person-hours and was challenging. In the end, the College was successful and the workload in Admissions was eased.
